



## Mr Charles Nelson Stinnett Jr

August 8, 1933 - August 15, 2022

Charles Nelson Stinnett, Jr., 89, of Gulf Shores, Alabama passed away peacefully at home on August 15, 2022. In addition to his wife Rose Ann of 65 years, Charles leaves a son, Charles Nelson Stinnett, III(Keri) of Lexington, South Carolina, daughters, Dr. Elizabeth Ann White (Len) of Dothan, Alabama and Dr. Robyn Sue Stinnett (Rich Pokorny) of Louisville, Kentucky; granddaughters, Virginia Stinnett, Katy Pokorny and Mary Frances White and grandsons, Charlie Stinnett, Dr. Luke White and Sean Pokorny. Charles is also survived by a brother, James Richard Stinnett (Irene) of Canton, North Carolina, a sister-in-law, Peggy Boykin of Aiken, South Carolina and a brother-in-law, Ray Warren (Sara) of Clyde, North Carolina, along with many nieces, nephews and cousins.

Charles was born on August 8, 1933, to the late Charles Nelson Stinnett, Sr. and Mazie Ann Elizabeth Patton Stinnett in Asheville, North Carolina. He grew up hunting and fishing in the Smoky Mountains of Western North Carolina. He left his home in 1951 to serve in the United States Navy aboard the USS John R. Craig DD885 during the Korean War. Following graduation from North Carolina State University with a B.S. in Mechanical Engineering, Charles began his career with International Paper working at numerous locations throughout the world and eventually becoming the Director of Corporate Engineering in Mobile, Alabama. After retirement from International Paper, Charles continued as a consultant for International Paper and the

forest products industry before fully retiring to Gulf Shores, Alabama in 2013. With the love and support of his devoted wife Rose Ann, Charles' career spanned six decades across six continents. He could always be counted on by friends and family to keep them entertained with his extraordinary memory for colorful and humorous details in stories from his countless travels, which included many road and trail running adventures that aptly earned him the nickname "Iron Man."
