Kenneth J. Steiner, 80, a native of Mobile and long time resident of Fort Morgan, AL died peacefully after a lengthy illness on January 3, 2017 surrounded by his family. He is survived by his wife, Emily, his sons Jon and Lee, daughter-in-law, Alison, grandson Brock of Gulf Shores and his daughter, Kemily Wilson and granddaughters Kahle and Kyndal of Fairhope, his sister Carol Ann Curran, brother in law Stroud Curran and many nieces and nephews. He is preceded in death by his parents CW and Bina Steiner of Mobile and Gulf Shores.

Ken was a graduate of Murphy High School in Mobile and the University of Southern Mississippi in Hattiesburg. He served in the United States Marine Corp. He was an active member of Gulf Shores United Methodist Church. He volunteered throughout his community, but one of his greatest accomplishments was initiating and organizing a volunteer fire department for the Fort Morgan area. Eventually, he was honored when the station was officially named the Kenneth J. Steiner Volunteer Fire Department.

The funeral is scheduled for Friday, January 6, 2017, at 9:30a.m. at Gulf Shores United Methodist Church with Reverend Glenn Butler and Dr. David McClain officiating. A reception at the church hall will follow the burial at Pine Rest Cemetery in Foley.
