December 20, 1961 - December 11, 2019

Mark Jeffers, of Foley, Ala., died Wednesday, Dec. 11, 2019, peacefully in his sleep with his beloved chihuahua Louie by his side. He was 57.

Born in Bowdon, Ga., on Dec. 20, 1961, Mark grew up in west Georgia before starting his family in Anniston, Ala., where he lived and worked for many years before moving with his family to Foley in 1999, where he lived for the remainder of his days. He died nine days short of what would have been his 58th birthday.

Mark is survived by his wife of more than 30 years, Kimberly, of Gulf Shores, Ala.; his son Kevin of Atlanta, Ga.; his daughter Allison of Foley, Ala.; his son Jared of Pensacola, Fla.; siblings Margie Duffey and Jimmy Jeffers; and three grandchildren: Noah, Riley and August. Mark is also survived by a host extended family members in Cleburne County, Ala., and elsewhere across the southeast, including Angela Hughes and Terry Jeffers of Heflin, and mother-in-law Marilyn Townsend of Lake Jackson, Texas.

Mark was preceded in death by his mother Rilla Jeffers, brothers Donald Jeffers and Joe Jeffers, sister Shirley Jeffers Smith, sister-in-law Judy Kelly Jeffers, cousin-in-law Dottie Ann Jeffers, and nephew Terry Charles Jeffers Jr.
